INTRODUCTION

As part of the Kilkenny County Council Vacant Homes Action Plan, Site Appraisal

Reports are being carried out on a number of vacant / derelict houses and sites around

the county to determine their potential for social housing using CPO process.

It is Kilkenny County Councils intention to provide new housing and improve

associated social and community infrastructure as part of an overall Butts

Regeneration Project. While there are houses and lands in the area already in the

ownership of Kilkenny County Council, additional ground will be required to enable

the overall vision of the regeneration project to be achieved.

DETAILS

A. OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY:

Land is registered to a Patrick Cantwell (now deceased) in 2 folios KK500 and

KK496.

It is our understanding that several members of the Cantwell family are now

entitled to be registered as owners of these lands as follows:

B. SUITABILITY OF PROPERTY

DATE 1ST INSPECTION: 27th April 2021

PROPERTY LOCATION: This property is located off St. Joseph's Road on a narrow

laneway opposite The Enable Ireland O'Neill Centre, to the west. Kilkenny County

Council yard and workshop are located on the northern boundary and there are private gardens to the east and south.

CURRENT ZONING: Existing Residential

EXISTING SITE: Site is understood to have been back gardens and allotments in previous years, but has lain derelict for the past number of years

AREA: 0.2 Ha / 0.49 acre

HERITAGE STATUS: None

SERVICES: Mains water and wastewater in the area

PLANNING HISTORY: None.

C. NEED TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY

This appraisal has been done for following reasons:

- 1. To determine the potential for social housing
- 2. To address vacancy & dereliction and
- 3. To promote urban renewal

1. Social Housing Potential

This site is located in an area of very high housing demand in the centre of Kilkenny City, close to services and amenities. The site adjoins lands on the northern boundary owned by Kilkenny County Council, which are currently used as a storage depot and workshop. It would be KCCs intention to use the land acquired as part of an overall regeneration programme for the Butts area which would be intended to provide further housing and associated supporting infrastructure e.g. amenity areas, cycle ways, footpaths, parking.

2. Vacancy/Dereliction

The site has lain vacant and unused for many years. Clear current title is not in place and this is hindering development of the land. The descendants of Patrick Cantwell, entitled to be registered as owners wish to resolve the title issues and

are willing to dispose of the lands to Kilkenny County Council. If the title issue is not resolved it is likely that the site would remain vacant/undeveloped in the

longer term while there is an acute shortage of sites for housing in the city.

3. Urban Renewal

This site is in a key location within a long established residential area close to the

centre of the City and adjacent to the St. Canice's Architectural Conservation Area.

Acquisition and appropriate development of this site to support delivery of social

or affordable housing and associated infrastructure by Kilkenny County Council

would be a positive contribution to area and benefit the regeneration of the Butts

Area

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that Kilkenny County Council acquire this property using the CPO

process.
