Introduction

Kilkenny County Council, working with Carlow County Council and the Office of Public Works has commissioned ByrneLooby to assess and develop a viable, cost effective and sustainable flood relief scheme for Graiguenamanagh-Tinnahinch.

Public Participation

This is the second public engagement event for the project. An initial public engagement event to get the views of the people, businesses and stakeholders was held in June 2020.

The feedback from that event has informed the assessment and development of the scheme to-date and the purpose of this public engagement event is to present the findings of the assessments undertaken, to outline the options being developed to alleviate flooding and to obtain the views of the public and stakeholders on those options.
