A prominent, permanent and well-designed base will facilitate continued use by the groups identified and allow for further growth in the numbers using the river and the various activities on the river.

Potentially, this could also become the most important access point on the proposed river Nore Blueway, an important link in the development of outdoor tourism for the Kilkenny region.




WHAT'S NEEDED TO MAXIMISE THE BENEFITS OF THE RIVER IN THE HEART OF OUR CITY?

Access The slipway at Greens bridge needs to be constructed in accordance with European standards and national guidelines to accommodate the launch of rescue boats and other craft. Emergency access and parking is essential to accommodate jeep, trailer and rescue boats.

Toilet / shower and changing facilities / tea & coffee making facilities, meeting rooms and training room

Storage adjacent to the river for canadian canoes, kayaks, water safety equipment, buoys and access ramps.







Floating Pontoons would facilitate safe access for open water events such as triathlons & swims

A permanent canoe polo facility could easily be incorporated in this area also.


OPTIONS FOR STORAGE AND TOILET/SHOWER & CHANGING FACILITIES

A preferred option would be to incorporate the facilities into the Brewery Site Housing development, opening directly onto the river, reducing the portage of equipment.

The option of a new purpose built building could also be explored in the river garden, close to the existing entrance on Green Street. This building could be designed to complement the river garden and the attractiveness of the new public park with the backdrop of Green's bridge.

POTENTIAL FOR GREATER USE

Currently, there are at least **2500 individual** uses of the river Nore in the city in a year and this could be greatly increased if facilities were in place.

Leisure tourist visits to Kilkenny, day trips, leisure boats and river tours

Triathlons and open water swims

Kayaking schools, stand up paddle boarding, Dragon Boat paddling & rowing clubs

Play boating and training at Greens Bridge weir.


Potential as a centre of excellence for a number of kayaking disciplines with deep, relatively calm water, illuminated by street light for night training and a competition venue for national canoe polo events.








Dragon Boat Racing will bring more colour to the river in time















PROPOSED NORE VALLEY BLUEWAY

 \sim Nore is a total of 140km long and is navigable by small vessels.

Most popular access points are Kilkenny city, Bennettsbridge and Thomastown.

Blueway projects currently being developed on Barrow and Suir, complement a blueway development in the Nore valley.


The proposed Blueway trail forms a linear network of trails from Bleach road at the northern end of Kilkenny city to Inistioge.

Trail heads will be located in Kilkenny city, Bennettsbridge, Thomastown and Inistioge.

Discover the Blueway - an inviting network of water trails along the west coast of Ireland.


Stretching from north west Mayo to south
